Policy:

Uniform Care of Patients:

- 1. The planning and provision of care shall be based on individual patient assessment and shall and shall focus on the patient's response to actual or potential alterations to health.
- 2. All patients are treated alike irrespective of their religion, cast, social status, financial ability ect.

- 5. Laboratory facilities, OT facility, Diagnostics, Nursing Care are uniformly provided to all patients irrespective of category of patients.
- 6. All protocols are uniformly given in the same manner to all patients irrespective of the category.
- 7. Uniform care is guided by all laws & regulations.
- 8. It is further ensured that the care and treatment orders are legibly signed, named, timed and dated by the concerned doctors and nurses, the main idea being that the authors of these orders are identifiable by all and the chronology of care process is maintained.
- 9. Clinical preface guidelines are adopted to guide patient care whenever possible.
